Consider the ability to move the event online in case restrictions are reinforced. Encourage attendees to only attend if they display NO symptoms of Covid-19 	
The event format is indoors and/or has a high footfall.	 PPE/Government recommended face coverings to be worn by all attendees and event staff Limit the number of attendees Stagger times with the ability to have regular cleaning intervals 	
Event-goers are unlikely or unwilling to bring and wear face coverings or other PPE.	 Consider purchasing and providing Government recommended face coverings for all attendees. Message all attendees before arrival, advising them that face coverings and/or other PPE will be required for entry. Post signage at event entrances indicating that face coverings must be worn as a condition to enter the facility 	
The event will require exchange of items or provisions (e.g. ticket, identification, payment).	 Use a contactless method. Use RSVP's QR code to encourage digital donations. Keep disinfectant near all contact points. 	
The event will serve food or beverages to attendees.	 Eliminate food and beverage service from your event. Consider pre-packaged, single-serve options. Consider avoiding all communal buffet-style meals.
